iPhone Password Management



Good Practice


- Use complicated passwords.
- Don't reuse passwords.
- Have a back up system.

Prerequisites

- Must use a Passcode/Finger Print/Face ID.
- May need your Passcode/Apple ID Password.
- Have Two Factor Authentication (2FA) on.
- Have Keychain on.

Two-Factor Authentication

- Tap Settings. 
- Tap your name (at top of page).
- Tap Sign-in & Security.
- Ensure Two-Factor Authentication is on.




Keychain

- Remembers Passwords.
- Synchronizes across devices.
- Autofills information.
- End-to-End encryption.

5. Turn on Sync this iPhone




